

# Greenock to Cruise Loch Long

## Greenock leave 1145 back 1745

Sail from Custom House Quay.

Quay Postcode: PA15 1EQ

Nearest Transport Links: Greenock Central 0.5 miles.

Parking: Available on & around the Quay.

Please ensure that you are at the ship 10 minutes prior to the departure time. Boarding closes 3 minutes before departure on outward and return journeys.



## Your Journey

Step aboard at Greenock and you will sail past the 'Tail of the Bank'. See Cloch point and Lighthouse as you steam down the coast towards Largs. Look out for a castle and a marina. As you approach Largs, get great views of the Isles of Bute, Arran and Cumbrae.

Then enjoy a steam across the water to the Cowal Peninsula and follow the scenic coastline as you make your way towards Dunoon and then on to Loch Long.

The cruise will sail amid the dramatic mountain scenery of the Clyde 'Fjords' Loch Long & Loch Goil after cruising to Dunoon. Loch Goil is an arm of Loch Long and is a fjord type sea loch surrounded by breathtaking scenery.

When on board Waverley there is so much to see and experience. Don't forget to go below and see the mighty steam engines propelling the famous paddles through the sea: an experience unique to Waverley!

You can soak in the atmosphere of Waverley restored to her original 1940s style, and roll back time to a by-gone era. Enjoy a refreshment in one of the ship's period lounge bars or enjoy a hot meal in the Art Deco Dining Saloon – best booked in advance.

*During your journey, passengers will disembark and embark at Largs and Dunoon, but there is not enough time for you to disembark and explore.*

## History and Heritage

Waverley is the last seagoing Paddle Steamer in the World! When you step aboard you are stepping back to a time when Paddle Steamers were an important part of coastal passenger and excursion trade.

Dating back to the 1800's, this tradition remains alive today only in the operation of Paddle Steamer Waverley. She is Britain's largest interactive exhibit.

Onboard you can learn about Britain's maritime history and its social contribution: from the heritage craftsmanship, to traditional seafaring skills through to the engineering masterpiece - the triple expansion engine at the heart of the ship turning the famous paddles.

The Captain, Officers & Crew look forward to welcoming you onboard to recapture the nostalgia of bygone days and enjoy a great day out.

## Eating & Drinking

Waverley has a restaurant which offers passengers everything from soups, sandwiches, snacks & afternoon tea to a 3-course meal. The menu is available to view on the website and onboard. You are not permitted to bring alcohol onboard but the ship has two lounge bars and a tearoom. You are welcome to bring packed lunches on board, however you cannot eat these in the ship's Dining Saloon as seats are reserved for passengers purchasing food onboard.
